- An excellent Dyeing Laboratory, Design Section, Weaving Section, Printing Section, Photography Section, Library and Documentation Section and Computer Aided Textile Design Section for sample development, training, expert guidance and for extension services.

Design Section:

Textile Designers drawn from the best talent available in various ART and Design Institute are constantly engaged in preparing paper and Computer designs. These designs comprise both for weaving and for hand block printing. The attempt is to preserve traditional designs by reviving them and/ or adopting them in the requirements of the market. These designs help in production of items both for

domestic and export markets. The CAD facility, which will be in operation soon for service to weavers, textiles, designers etc. of the State of West Bengal. The Centre have the services of Jala makers, graph paper designers who work in close association with the Dyeing Laboratory and the Weaving Section. Care is taken to see that the designs developed are within the discipline imposed by the types of yarn, dye stuffs and weaving techniques as per requirements of the sector.

Weaving Section:

Skilled weavers drawn from the main traditional weaving communities of the country-man work here. They are supervised by qualified Handloom/ textile technologists. Facilities of prototype looms and weaving equipments are available in the Section. Fabrics in new designs and new textures are produced using different yarns. The Section also undertakes simple improvements in looms and in the processes of weaving. Service for development of rich traditional Handloom fabrics of Bengal i.e. Baluchari, Jamdani, Tangail, Dhaniakhali, Santipuri, Bishnupuri, Begampuri etc including diversified jute fabrics is also provided to the weavers and implementing agencies. The implementing agencies are also being assisted in formulation and execution of handloom developmental projects and schemes.

DYEING AND PRINTING SECTION

Equipped Dye Laboratory manned by experienced dyers and other technical personnel capable of developing techniques in cost effective processing of fibres is available in the premises of WSC, Kolkata. This Laboratory brings out number of shade cards for silk, cotton, wool, jute and other fibres/yarns, fabrics for the use of the designers, dyers, weavers and implementing agencies. Technical assistance also being provided for shade matching, solving problems and sample development on charge basis. In addition to the synthetic dye technology transmission of natural dyeing process is also provided. This Section also carries out experiments in preparation of basic materials for hand block printing as well as screen-printing. Dischargeable and non-dischargeable dye stuff have been effectively used to obtain multiple effects of rare beauty. Weavers' Service Centre, Kolkata has expertise in block and screen making and cordially develop new designs and pattern. Sizeable hand-block and screen are purchased for use by printing units and Handloom organizations.

DESIGN DEVELOPMENT & PHOTOGRAPHY SECTION

Innovate and develop designs, motifs, patterns and prints, via in-house skills, on a regular/on going basis, through appropriate systems and trained designers and synchronization of traditional designs etc. with modern and contemporary designs. For this purpose development of in-house designs undertaken based on:

(a) Specific demand from the market in terms of apex societies, weavers cooperative, Producer Company, Master Weavers, institutions, exporters, manufacturers or private persons.

(b) As per the demand of the International market in terms of colour, design and fashion forecast.

(c) Revival of market-worthy traditional motifs.

(d) textile Designers are constantly research from various sources e.g. Museums, Temples, Palaces, Havelis/Houses, State/National Archives, Private Collectors, College of Arts/Crafts, Caves, Book of Arts/Artcrafts & Handicrafts/carvings, wood metal, stone, ivory etc. Societies/Corporations / Associations / Guilds / Journals / Manuscripts / Miniature paintings/ Antique furniture / Potteries / Tombs / Series of Art & Industry Collections/ Cataloguing Books. Maintain and update an inventory/data bank/warehouse of designs, motifs, patterns, prints, etc. and display developed samples in exhibition halls. Popularise increasing adaptation and doption of designs, etc. as a vital ingredient of value-added product development/diversification and for the creation and sustenance of a culture of quality. Encourage the sale of designs, prints etc. on a non-exclusive right basis. Weavers' Service Centre, Kolkata is linked with the National Centre for Textile Design, New Delhi in order to provide information to weavers in terms of fast changing consumer preferences, fashion trends and technological developments in the means of communications both within and outside the country. W.S.C. has linkages with National Institute of Fashion Technology, Kolkata, Export Promotion Councils, State Handloom agencies having Design Centres, Apex Trade Bodies both inside and outside the country and related linkages to textile resource sites. It has database of reputed handloom manufacturers, fiber suppliers, spinners and yarn makers, machinery and fashion accessories suppliers, garment manufacturer etc. The online activity of the WSC in consultation with NCTD involve fabric collection, cataloguing according to region, locality to maintain a Museum of Heritage Textile of the region and locality having collection of motifs in the form of line drawing and swatches and samples. WSC holds periodically organizing on a continuous basis special thematic exhibitions. The basic idea behind such exhibitions is to produce exquisite quality of handloom cloths from master weavers through out India in order to sustain and excel in the quality aspect and to promote the marketing of handloom products on a sustained basis.

The Photographic Section of WSC, Kolkata has built up a valuable and informative source material of photographs depicting rare pieces of exceptional and traditional designs, costumes, fabric-samples, forms of art from Museums etc. Different techniques of production in weaving, dyeing and printing, specially for the traditional fabrics of Bengal are preserved in photographs.

LIBRARY & DOCUMENTATION SECTION

A collection of cloth samples, photographs, colour slides, books and periodicals dealing with various aspects of the Handloom industry is available in these sections.

TRAINING

Weavers' Service Centres arrange training in house as well as in the field level through various schemes of Ministry of Textiles. At present under (SAMARTH) scheme and also through National Handloom Development Programme (NHDP) and (CHCDS)

under Cluster Development Scheme (CDP) are on and trainings are given to semi-skilled and skilled weavers for product development, product diversification and improvement in productivity in dyeing technique and design development on looms. Individual Weavers, Primary handloom cooperative societies, NGO, Producer Company can be benefited under this scheme at the doorsteps of the weavers concentrated areas.

2. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

R & D work is carried out for loom development, design modification, development of shade cards, natural dyes, unique sample development, and is available at reasonable prices in WSC. Extension services are provided through training programmes or at very reasonable charges. To look into the usability, manufacture and improvement of materials used in the handloom industry and other trades or industries allowed therewith including designing, dyeing, bleaching, finishing, printing and chemical stores, etc.

- To assess the utilization of the products of the handloom industry as well as to assist members in the execution of sample orders. To do in house work for the improvement of various machinery and appliances used by the handloom industry and other trades or industries.
- To investigate into and help improvement of various processes of manufacture with a view to securing greater efficiency, rationalization and reduction of costs.

NATIONAL HANDLOOM DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME(NHDP & CHCDS) Promotion of Excellence

WSC Kolkata, implemented and monitor various projects under National Handloom Development Programme (NHDP) and (CHCDS) in West Bengal and Sikkim. This projects are being implemented with an aim for sustainable development of weavers with overall support by provided through Skill up gradation training, upgraded looms, accessories under HSS, providing work shed, create Common Facility Centre in the Block, establish market linkages through engagement of Textile Designer in the cluster Etc. Total 27 Block Level Cluster implemented / Supervise under the guidance of WSC Kolkata in West Bengal and Sikkim during 2015-16 to 2020-21.

FORMATION OF PRODUCER COMPANY

The Producer Company provides more legitimacy and credibility in the immediate business environment. It allows registered and non registered groups or user groups to become equity holder. In West Bengal 13 new Producer Company registered and working with handlooms.

NATIONAL AWARD / SANT KABIR AWARD AND PADMA AWARD.

National Award and Sant Kabir Award conferred to handloom weavers in recognition their outstanding craftsmanship and have valuable contribution to the development of the sector. Padma Award given to the eminent personalities in for the notable achievers in the sector for the contribution to the craft and contribution to the society. There are several National Awardee and Sant Kabir Awardees recommended by this

office and recently Sh. Biren Kumar Basak has received Padma Award from the state for his contribution and outstanding art in handloom.

MARKET SUPPORT

It provides marketing guidance in coordination with State and Central Government e.g. Nominating and forwarding societies/master weavers for participation in Dilli Haat, Suraj Kund Mela, Taj Mahotsav, Shilparamam gram Hyderabad, Udaipur Craft Mela etc. this office also registered various stake holder of handlooms in Government E Marketing platform (GEM)

Presently Ministry of Textiles has been launched indiahanmade.com E-Commerce portal only for the Hnadloom & Handicraft artisans, form West Bengal there are number of Weavers co operative societies, Producer company, Individual weavers including TANTUJA has been registered in the portal and good nos. of order generated till date.

Indian Government has introduced "Handloom Mark" for the products being woven on handlooms to have a label "handwoven In INDIA" to provide a collective identity and to guarantee the buyer that the products being purchased are genuinely handwoven.

India Hnadloom Brand is an initiative of Ministry of Textiles, Government of India for branding of high quality handloom product. It is to encourage production high quality defect free niche product with minimal impact on environment.
